**Sub: Minutes of the SLC(LT) meeting for Power held on 6.11.2007.**


Sir,

I am directed to refer to your letter No.NGP/WCL/S&M/C-12(348)/620 dated 1.11.2008 on the above subject.

2. As per the New Coal Distribution Policy, the satisfaction level for Power is 100% whereas for others it is 75%. Therefore, while examining and considering the request for change of priority as well as allocation of coal to Co-gen Plants, SLC (LT), in its meeting held on 6.11.2007 (item No.4 & 6), had decided that CIL/coal companies should enter into FSA in terms of Co-gen Plants accordingly i.e. 100% for the power and 75% for other uses i.e. processing etc. Subsequently, this position was also clarified vide letter No.23021/75/2006-CPD dated 15<sup>th</sup> April, 2008 while dealing with the representation made by M/s. J.K. Paper Ltd., (S.No.2 of item No.4). In this case, WCL has already found that M/s. Atul Ltd. is a Co-gen Plant and, therefore, the decision of the SLC(LT) as well as clarification issued subsequently vide letter dated 15<sup>th</sup> April, 2008 is also applicable Mutantis-mutandis to M/s, Atul Ltd. as well as any other similar place Cogen Power Plants covered by the aforesaid decision of SLC(LT) and clarifications issued subsequently thereto.

3. You are, therefore, requested to enter into FSA accordingly in the case of M/s. Atul Ltd. as well as other pending cases, if any and action taken in matter may be intimated to the Ministry.
